Kansas Active Transportation Enhancement

BIL, IKE and KATE

- BIL Bipartisan Infrastructure Law
 - TAP funds increased 60-70%
 - New Safe Streets and Roads for All (<u>SS4A</u>) Program
 - Requires <u>VRU Safety Assessment</u>
 - Requires "Complete Streets" standards or policies for state DOTs
 - And much more!
- IKE Eisenhower Legacy Transportation Program
 - 10-year program that addresses highways, bridges, public transit, aviation, short-line rail, and active transportation needs across Kansas
- KATE <u>Kansas Active Transportation Enhancement</u>
 - Provides grants, technical assistance, outreach, and programs to improve active transportation in Kansas.
 - Responsible for initiating and coordinating the strategies and actions recommended in the 2023 Kansas Active Transportation Plan

What does the KATE Program Do?

- The KATE Program provides grants, technical assistance, outreach, and programs to improve active transportation in Kansas.
- The KATE Program is also responsible for initiating and coordinating the strategies and actions recommended in the 2023 <u>Kansas Active Transportation Plan</u>.

 KATE supports building the capacity of communities of all sizes, including those in urban, suburban, and rural areas, to provide safe and convenient active transportation options for people of all ages, abilities, and backgrounds.




Baseline Data Collection


- Vulnerable Road User (VRU) Analysis
 - VRU High Injury Network
 Map and Rate Map
 - Targeting VRU High Injury Networks for safety improvements and programming
 - Full study available-October/November
- Drive to Zero Dashboard
- Developing measures of equity and utilization

Funding for Active Transportation

KDOT Funding Opportunities:

- <u>Transportation Alternatives</u> next Call for Projects expected February 2024
- <u>Safe Routes to School</u> KATE funded Call for Applications for Planning to be released September 22, 2023
- IKE Program: <u>Community Resources</u>
- KDOT's <u>Cost Share Program</u> Call for projects in Spring and Fall.
 Proposals to integrate pedestrian and bicycle facilities into proposed road projects is encouraged. Stand-alone active transportation projects also eligible.
- Safe Streets 4 All Match Pilot Program

External Funding Opportunities:

- USDOT <u>Pedestrian and Bicycle Funding Opportunities</u> Table
- KDWP Recreation Trail Program Funds recreational trails, trail heads and amenities, etc.
