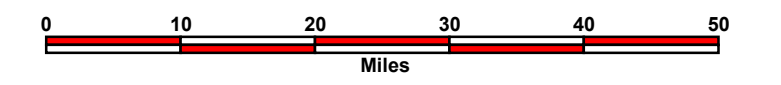


# 2021 TRAFFIC FLOW MAP KANSAS STATE HIGHWAY SYSTEM

The traffic counts shown on this map represent estimates of the Annual Average Daily Traffic (AADT) and Annual Average Daily Truck Traffic (AADTT) for the year ending December 31, 2020. These estimates are developed mainly from 24-hour volumes recorded by portable traffic counters. These short-term counts are adjusted for day-of-week and seasonal variations using data from continuous permanent counters. An axle correction factor has been applied to each short-term count. AADTT's are developed from vehicle classification counts. These classification count locations are indicated by bold numbers on the map. AADTT at other locations are estimated from nearby counts on the same route or from other routes known to have similar traffic characteristics. AADTT's that are developed from continuous permanent counters are underlined.

Starting in March 2020, businesses, government and schools reacted to the Covid-19 pandemic with closings and schedule changes. Traffic was more reduced in the east than the west, and more in urban than rural areas. This map reflects the best estimates of annual traffic, but is unlikely to represent long-term trends.
