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U.S. 50 in Stafford County to receive crack repair

Asphalt crack repair is expected to begin Thursday, Oct. 1, on a 15-mile section of U.S. 50 in Stafford County.


The project will stretch on U.S. 50 from the U.S. 281 junction in Stafford County to the Reno County line.

The work is expected to be completed around Oct. 9, depending on the weather.

During the work, traffic will be controlled by flaggers and a pilot car, so motorists should be prepared to stop. Motorists will face delays of up to 15 minutes.

The Kansas Department of Transportation is overseeing the project.

Mission Construction Co. Inc., of St. Paul, Kansas, is the primary contractor for the \$98,400 project.
