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Survey to begin for U.S. 183 bridge replacement in Kiowa County

A field survey for a proposed bridge replacement on U.S. 183 in Kiowa County will start around Jan. 4.


The survey is for a proposed bridge replacement over East Fork Rattlesnake Creek, 11.87 miles north of the Comanche County line. The proposed project is south of Greensburg.

The approximate length of the survey is 4,000 feet, and it will be based on existing alignment. The survey is estimated to be completed by March 15.

A member of the survey crew first will contact property owners and/or tenants for permission to enter private property. Survey activities will include the use of survey instruments on the ground to determine locations of existing features within the survey corridor.
