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Survey for U.S. 56 bridge in Rice County set to begin around Jan. 25

A field survey for a proposed replacement bridge on U.S 56 in Rice County is scheduled to begin around Jan. 25.

The proposed replacement is over Spring Creek drainage 6.85 miles east of the Barton County line.

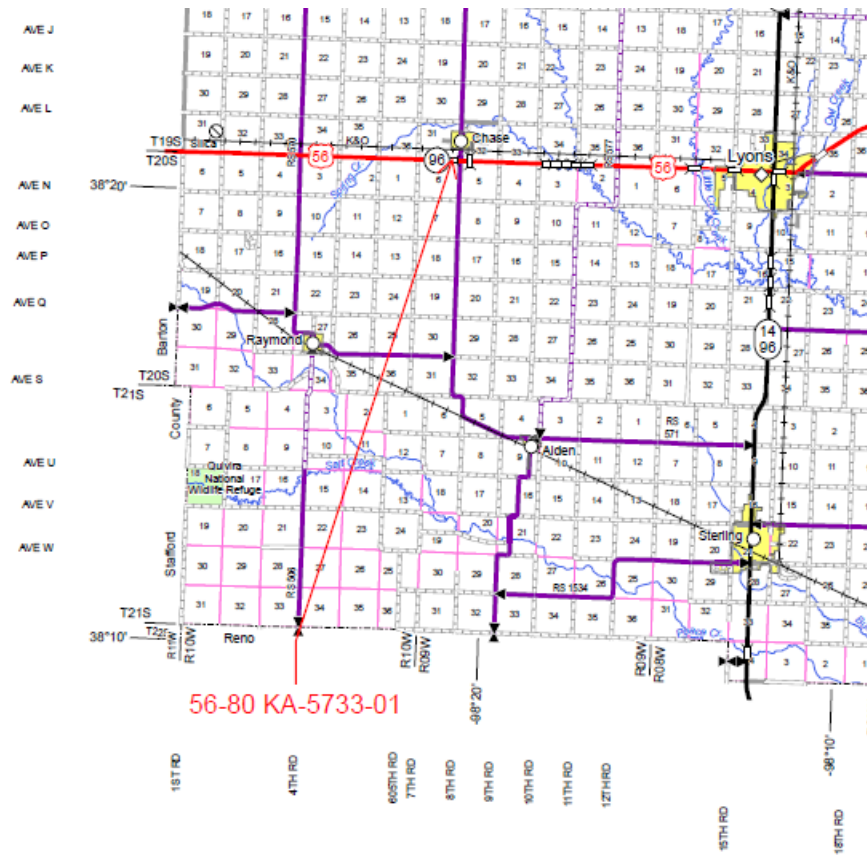
The approximate length of survey is 2,000 feet. The survey is based on existing alignment.

The survey is needed for the detailed design of the proposed improvement and is estimated to be completed by April 1.

A member of the survey crew first will contact property owners and/or tenants for permission to enter private property. Survey activities will include use of survey instruments on the ground to determine locations of existing features within the survey corridor.
