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## Field survey for K-11 bridge replacement in Kingman County

A field survey for a proposed bridge replacement on K-11 in Kingman County will start around Monday, May 10.


The proposed bridge replacement is on K-11 over Smoots Creek, 5.7 miles north of the U.S. 54 junction. The approximate length of the survey is 3,000 feet. The survey is based on existing alignment.

The field survey – estimated to be completed by July 1 -- will gather information needed for detailed design of the proposed improvement.

A member of the survey crew first will contact property owners and/or tenants for permission to enter private property. Survey activities will include the use of survey instruments on the ground to determine locations of existing features within the survey corridor.

John Lilak, P.S., Survey Project Manager, Bartlett West, will be in charge of the survey for the Kansas Department of Transportation.
