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## K-61 project for guardrail, grading and culverts begins soon in Reno County


A K-61 project to replace guardrail, do grading and repair or extend culverts in Reno County will start around Monday, May 3.

The Kansas Department of Transportation project will occur at several locations on K-61 from around the northeast city limits of Arlington to the U.S. 50/K-61 junction. The length is 8.7 miles.

During the work – to be completed around late September – traffic will be reduced to one lane and controlled by a pilot car and flaggers or traffic signals. Motorists should be prepared to stop for the traffic control and face delays of up to 15 minutes. Although there will be multiple work locations, traffic will be restricted at only one location at a time.

J&J Contractors Inc., of Iola, is the primary contractor for the \$766,357 project.
