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### **\$6.2 million resurfacing on U.S. 160, K-1 in Comanche County to start**

A nearly \$6.2 million project to mill and overlay U.S. 160 and K-1 in Comanche County is expected to begin around June 18.

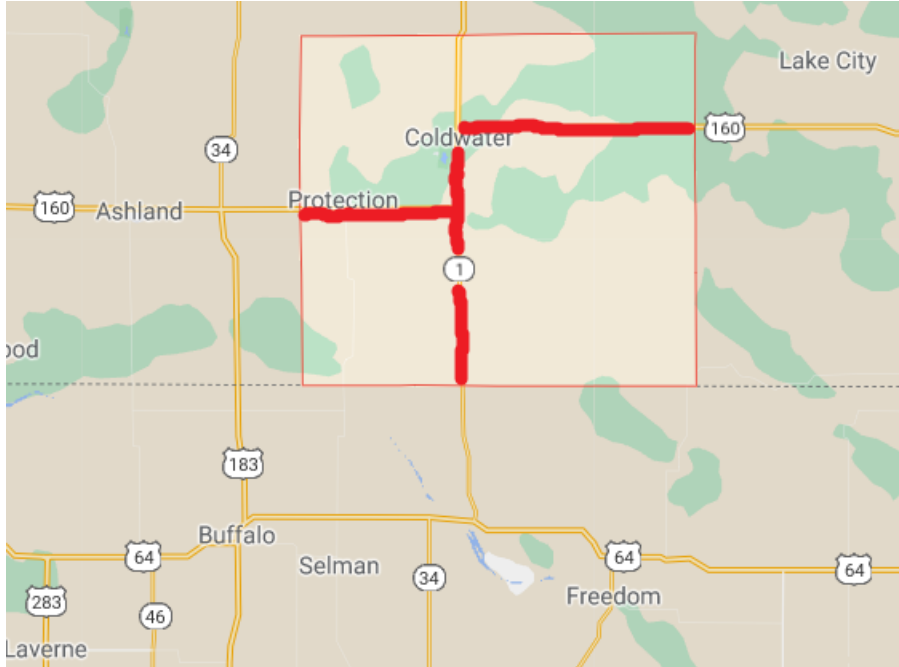
The Kansas Department of Transportation project will be on U.S. 160 from the Clark/Comanche county line to the Comanche/Barber County line. The approximate length is about 36 miles. The work on K-1 will be from the Oklahoma state line to the U.S. 160/183 junction. The length is about 13 miles.

During the project – to be completed around early August, traffic will be controlled by flaggers and a pilot car, and motorists should expect delays of up to 15 minutes.

During part of the work, K-1 will be closed for up to five days starting around July 5. During the K-1 closure, the detour will be on U.S. 183 in Kansas and U.S. 64 in Oklahoma.

Venture Corp., of Great Bend, is the primary contractor for the \$6,196,335 project.
