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Bridge replacement on I-70 in Dickinson County resumes Monday

The Kansas Department of Transportation will resume work on Monday, March 22 to replace the bridges on I-70 over Chapman Creek in Dickinson County. The westbound bridge will be replaced first, in the spring through the fall of 2021. The eastbound bridge will be replaced next, in the spring through the fall of 2022.

Construction will take place during daylight hours and traffic will be reduced to one 16.5-foot lane at a reduced speed of 60 mph through the work zone. Drivers should expect minor delays, not exceeding five minutes.

Reece Construction of Salina is the primary contractor for this \$5.7 million project. The contractor has scheduled work to be completed by November 2022.
