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## Resurfacing on U.S. 24 begins Friday in Cloud County


On Friday, March 26, the Kansas Department of Transportation will begin a mill and overlay on U.S. 24 in Cloud County.

Work on the eastbound and westbound lanes of U.S. 24 will occur 2 miles east of 220 road and head east for approximately 7 miles to the Cloud/Clay County line. (See attached map.)

As work progresses, traffic signals will be used to direct one 11-foot lane of traffic through the work zone at a reduced speed. Drivers should be prepared for a delay of up to 15 minutes.

Ebert Construction Co. Inc., of Wamego is the prime contractor and has scheduled this \$7 million project to be completed in November, weather permitting.
