Multi-county rumble strip installation begins Monday

Beginning Monday, Oct.18, 2021 the Kansas Department of Transportation will install rumble strips on K-82 in Riley and Clay counties and on U.S. 81 in Cloud and Republic counties.

Work will begin on K-82 extending east from about seven miles east of K-15 to U.S. 77. Traffic on K-82 will be controlled by flaggers and a pilot car through the work zone. Drivers should be prepared for a delay of up to 15 minutes at this location and plan accordingly.

Next, work will move to U.S. 81, extending from about three miles south of the Cloud/Republic county line to the Nebraska state line. Traffic on U.S. 81 will be reduced to one lane in each direction where the contractor is actively working. Drivers can expect minimal delays at this location, not exceeding five minutes.

Surface Preparation Technologies LLC of Kingstown, PA is the prime contractor and has scheduled this \$85,000 project to be completed by Oct. 27, weather permitting.

KDOT urges all motorists to be alert and obey the warning signs when approaching and driving through a highway work zone.
