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Resurfacing begins tomorrow in Washington County


Beginning tomorrow, the Kansas Department of Transportation will begin a chip seal on K-148, K-234 and K-243 in Washington County.

Work on K-148 will extend North to the Nebraska state line from the K-148/U.S. 36 junction, work on K-234 will extend from K-148 to the east city limits of Hanover, and work on K-243 will extend from K-148 to the Pony Express Station. (See attached map.)

Flaggers and a pilot car will direct one lane of traffic through construction. Drivers should be prepared for a delay of up to 15 minutes and plan extra time in their travel schedules.

Circle C Paving and Construction, LLC. Of Goddard is the prime contractor and has scheduled this \$343,857 project to be completed by August, weather permitting.
