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K-96 resurfacing will resume in Sedgwick County

After a winter break in construction, work will resume soon on a resurfacing project on K-96 in Sedgwick County.

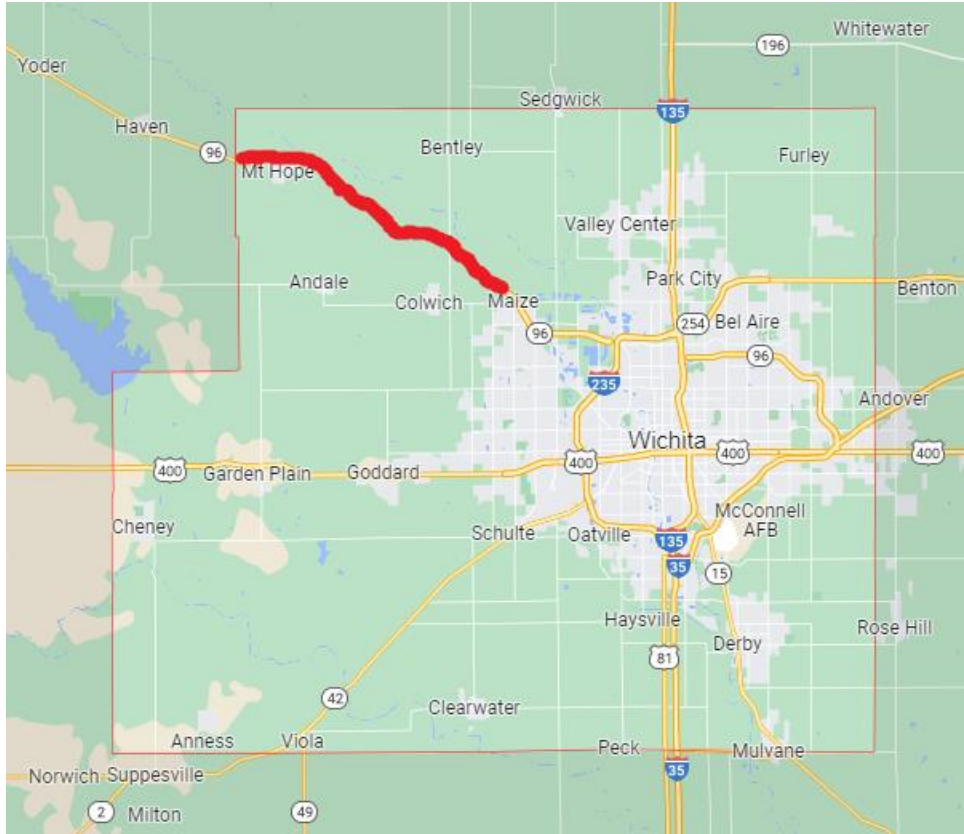
The Kansas Department of Transportation project involves a hot-mix-asphalt overlay and shoulder widening. Before the winter break, crews completed the Reno County portion of the project, on K-14 and K-96. The remainder of the project is on eastbound K-96 from the Sedgwick/Reno county line east to about Maize Road, a length of about 15 miles.

The work is expected to begin around April 4 and be completed around mid-May.

During the work, traffic will be restricted to one lane, and motorists should expect to slow down for the work zone.

Cornejo & Sons, of Wichita, is the primary contractor for the \$7,862,279 project.
