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Chip and seal project on K-92 in Jefferson County to begin July 1


According to the Kansas Department of Transportation, a chip and seal project on K-92, in Jefferson County, will begin Wednesday, July 1 and expected to be complete Friday, July 3, weather permitting. Work will occur from the north city limit of McLouth and go to the Jefferson County/Leavenworth County line.

The chip and seal process sprays oil on the road and covers it with rock chips. Work will take place 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.

Two lane traffic will be reduced to one lane and the lane width, in the work area, will be reduced. Traffic will be controlled using a pilot car operation, traffic cones and signage. Motorists should expect delays of up to 15 minutes. All lanes will be open outside of work hours.

Vance Brothers, of Kansas City, Mo, is the contractor on the \$150,000 project.
