Ramp and lane closures in Wyandotte County June 13 to June 21

Ramp and lane closures are scheduled in Wyandotte County, Saturday, June 13 to Sunday, June 21, according to the Kansas Department of Transportation. Traffic on all these projects will be diverted using mobile lane closures, signage and traffic cones.

For grading work, ramp closures include:

- Southbound Turner Diagonal Freeway to westbound I-70, and eastbound I-70 to southbound Turner Diagonal Freeway, June 13, from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m.
- Southbound Turner Diagonal Freeway to westbound I-70, and eastbound I-70 to Turner Diagonal Freeway, June 15 to June 19, from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

For guardrail maintenance, closures include:

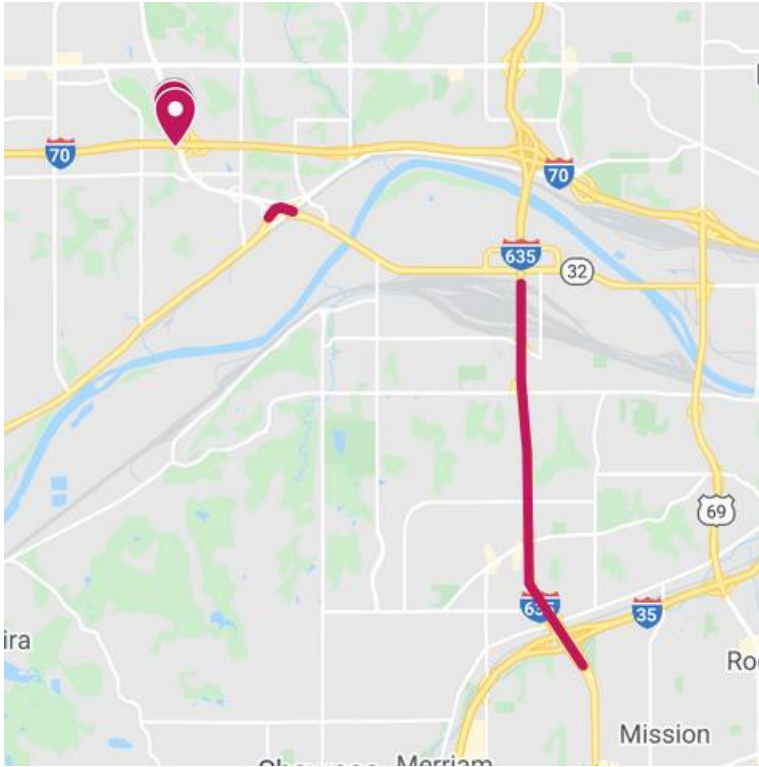
- Left lane on westbound K-32 at 61st Street, June 15, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

For pavement patching, the closures include:

- Alternating two lanes of northbound and southbound I-635 from Foster Street to the BSNF Railyard Bridge.
- The ramps from northbound and southbound I-635 to I-35, will close intermittently.

Work will occur June 15 to June 19, from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. and June 20 and June 21, from 10 p.m. to 8 a.m.
