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Resurfacing on I-435 in Johnson County to begin Saturday

A resurfacing project on I-435 in Johnson County to begin Saturday, August 15, weather permitting. Work will occur in the northbound lanes of I-435, from Midland Drive to the Kansas River. Traffic will be reduced to one lane as needed and ramps will be closed intermittently nightly.

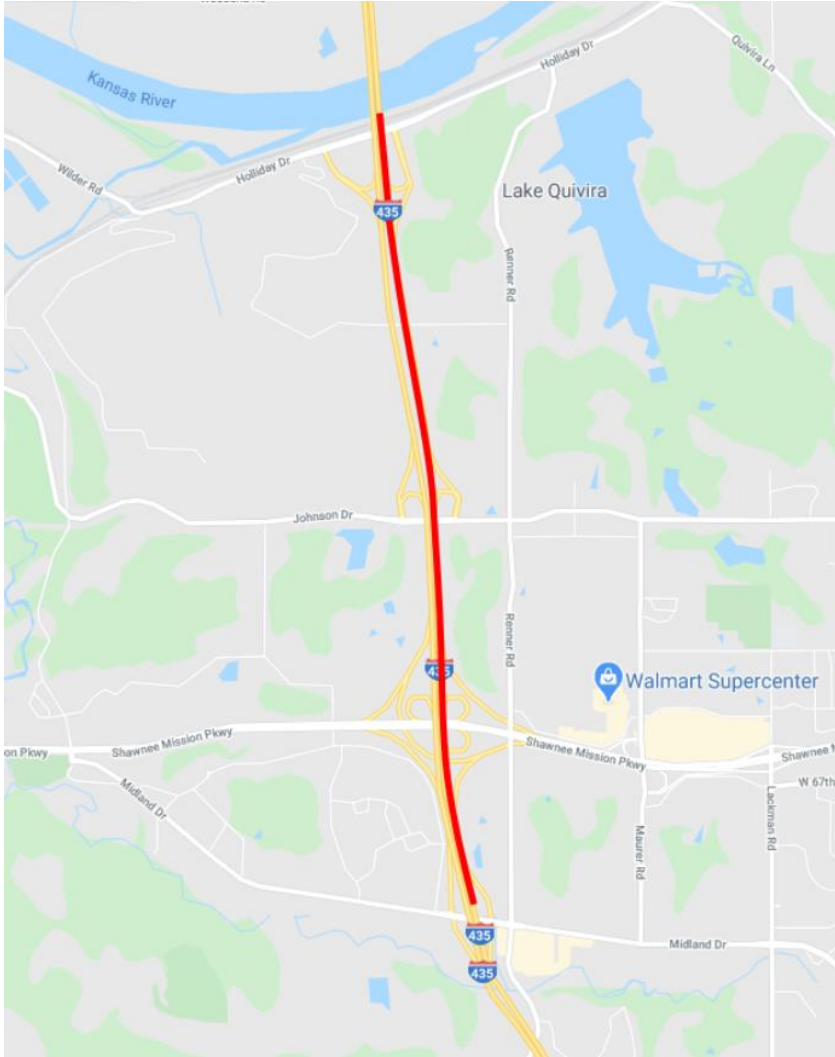
Work hours are 7 p.m. to 6 a.m., Monday through Friday, and 7 p.m. to 10 a.m. Saturdays and Sundays. The project is expected to be completed by mid-September.

Work will begin with concrete pavement patching, followed by asphalt milling and inlay, then pavement markings.

Traffic will be controlled using lane and ramp closures, portable message signs, arrow boards, signage and traffic cones. Motorists should expect travel delays.

Superior Bowen Asphalt Company of Kansas City, Mo. is the contractor on the \$850,000 project.
