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I-35 survey starts today in Johnson County

A Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) field survey is beginning today, Nov. 7, along I-35 in Johnson County.

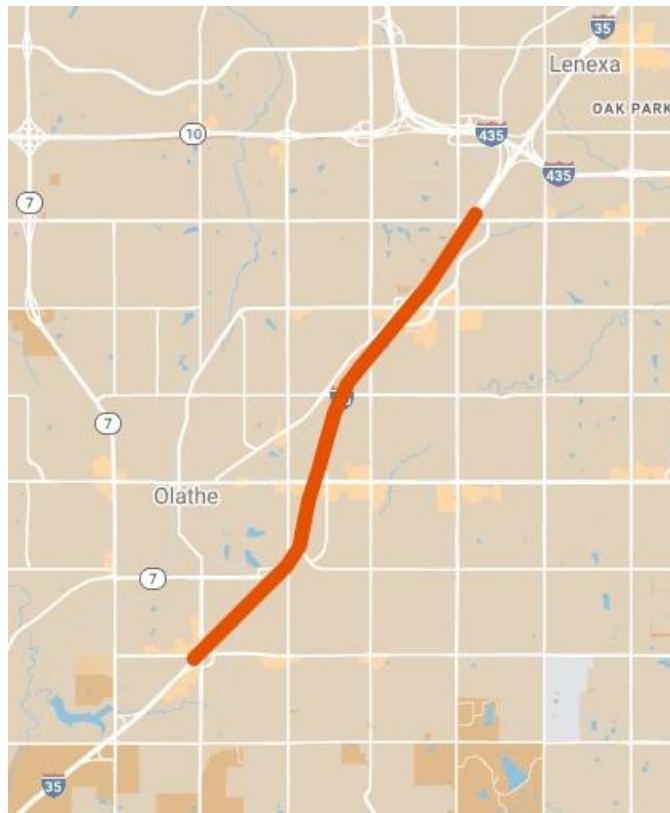
This survey is to gather information necessary for the discovery, design and construction for I-35 capacity improvement. The survey area includes the roadway and adjacent area one-half mile south of the I-35/151st Street interchange to approximately one-tenth mile north of the I-35/College Boulevard interchange.

The survey covers approximately 6.7 miles of I-35 and is estimated to be completed by May 2023.

Mark Lindenmeyer, P.S., Survey Project Manager, Wilson & Company, will manage this survey for KDOT.

A member of the survey crew first will contact property owners and/or tenants for permission to enter private property. Survey activities will include the use of survey instruments on the ground to determine locations of existing features within the survey corridor.
