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K-10 bridges and lanes reopen to traffic in Johnson County

Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) work on six of eight bridge projects on K-10 in western Johnson County has been completed. All K-10 lanes, from K-7 to Kill Creek, are open to traffic.

Deck patching and overlay work has been completed on the following westbound K-10 bridges: Evening Star Road, Sunflower Road, Camp Creek and Cedar Creek; and the following eastbound K-10 bridges: Cedar Creek Road and Cedar Creek Parkway.

Westbound K-10 bridge deck replacement over Lexington Avenue and pavement repairs on the westbound K-10 bridge over Kill Creek are expected to be completed in late November.

Capacity improvements are underway at the K-10/Lexington Avenue interchange, including added ramp lanes and traffic signal infrastructure. The KDOT project is expected to be completed in February 2023.
