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K-10/Lexington Avenue interchange improvement project will begin Oct. 28 in Johnson County

Improvements to the K-10/Lexington Avenue interchange are scheduled to begin Friday, Oct. 28, in Johnson County, weather permitting. The work will also require various lane reductions, according to the Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT).

In advance of the project beginning, on Thursday, Oct. 27, northbound and southbound Lexington Avenue will have a single lane closed in each direction, from 91st Street to 95th Street, which will remain closed until mid-December. During the project, construction activities may require work area closures and/or restrictions to the Lexington Avenue entrance and exit ramps.

Work will take place daily, Monday through Friday, from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m.


The project will address capacity improvements to the K-10 entrance and exit ramps at Lexington Avenue and will include a lane added to each of the eastbound and westbound ramps. An additional left turning lane will be added to each K-10 entrance ramp from Lexington Avenue and traffic signals will be installed at the eastbound K-10 entrance and exit ramps.

Traffic will be controlled using lane closures, portable message signs, arrow boards, signage and traffic cones.

Clarkson Construction Company, of Kansas City, Mo., is the contractor for the \$3.6 million project, which is scheduled to be completed in February 2023.
