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Southbound I-35 pavement improvement project starts Monday in Johnson County

A Kansas Department of Transportation pavement improvement project on southbound I-35, from I-635 to 95th Street, is scheduled to start Monday, March 18, in Johnson County, weather permitting.

The project includes concrete patching and overlay of southbound I-35 lanes and adjacent ramps.

For the duration of the project, work will be scheduled overnight, Sunday through Thursday, from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. and on Saturday and Sunday, from 7 p.m. to 8 a.m.


During these work times, nightly lane and ramp closures will be scheduled. Message boards have been posted in the area to alert motorists of upcoming work.

Traffic will be controlled using lane and ramp closures, portable message signs, arrow boards, signage and traffic cones.

Superior Bowen, of Kansas City, Mo., is the contractor for the \$12.2 million project, which is expected to be completed in early October.
