SS4A MATCH PILOT PROGRAM – 2022



BACKGROUND	The U.S. DOT has issued the Notice of Funding Opportunity to solicit applications for Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) grants. Funds are to be awarded on a competitive basis to support planning, infrastructure, behavioral, and operational initiatives to prevent death and serious injury on roads and streets involving all roadway users, including pedestrians; bicyclists; public transportation, personal conveyance, and micromobility users; motorists; and commercial vehicle operators.
OBJECTIVE	The Kansas SS4A Match Pilot Program provides financial assistance to local entities for the local match required by the grant. The Program will leverage state funds to increase total transportation investment and help both rural and urban areas of the state improve the local transportation system.
AVAILABLE FUNDING	Up to \$4 million is available during the 2022 pilot.
ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS	Eligible applicants for SS4A grants are (1) a metropolitan planning organization (MPO); (2) a political subdivision of a State or territory; (3) a federally recognized Tribal government; and (4) a multijurisdictional group of entities described in any of the aforementioned three types of entities.
LOCAL MATCH	KDOT will provide a minimum of 10% of the total cost to develop a Safety Action Plan for approved applicants. Additional consideration will be given to applicants that meet population thresholds and apply jointly with at least one other community.
REQUIREMENTS	Applicants must notify KDOT#SS4A@ks.gov with intention to apply for an Action Plan grant to receive funding and list KDOT as a partner for the local match funding source. A copy of the application shall be sent to KDOT#SS4A@ks.gov .
